



## **POVERTY AND ECONOMIC POLICY (PEP) RESEARCH NETWORK**

### **INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY STATEMENT**

Final reports from PEP-supported projects should be solely the work of the researchers (and signed only by them) with resource persons playing a purely advisory role (like a PhD thesis). Where a PEP team makes the request, we encourage resource persons to participate as co-authors in the preparation of subsequent publications (working papers, journal articles, etc.) where team and resource person feel that the resource person can make a substantive contribution that increases the relevance/quality of the research for domestic policy making, the likelihood of it being published and/or the reputation of the journal in which it is published.

One of PEP's main program objectives is to see that knowledge generated by the Project is widely disseminated and used for development. Researchers have the right to publish, in any form, the results of a PEP-funded project, or any other information prepared or produced as a result of a PEP-funded project, and are not required to obtain the consent of PEP to do so. Recipients will recognize the support of PEP by including in all publications the following acknowledgement:
