



Call for applications: 2018 PEP Research Fellowship

The Partnership for Economic Policy (PEP) invites applications for its 2018 Research Fellowship from all members of teams who have successfully participated in and completed at least one PEP-supported project.

Definition, rights and responsibilities of a PEP Research Fellow

A *PEP Research Fellow* is a researcher who has served as a member of a research team in a PEP project and who wishes to continue playing an active role in the PEP network.

The *PEP Research Fellowship* is a status of affiliation with PEP giving the selected fellows the right to apply for various types of support and participate in various PEP activities, outlined below. The *PEP Research Fellowship* is not a paid position.

Research Fellows may

- i) Provide scientific support to the design and implementation of PEP projects at the request of a [PEP Thematic Research Group](#) (TRG) or the [Executive Director](#).
- ii) Organize PEP Schools in their institution or country of residence in coordination with the relevant TRG leader.
- iii) Contribute to the dissemination of research outputs produced by PEP researchers (through national and international conferences and policy dialogues).
- iv) Apply for support on a competitive basis to present at international conferences or for study visits to finalize one of their own research projects, provided the research falls within one of [PEP's thematic areas](#) and subject to PEP's peer review and selection procedures.
- v) Initiate, develop and carry out new research projects with the technical support of PEP when the projects fit within the strategic priorities of PEP.
- vi) Be invited to participate in the PEP Annual Meeting for various activities (contribute to training activities, present PEP-funded or outside research, and if elected (see ix, below) participate in the Corporate Membership meeting).

vii) Submit their own research papers for publication as a PEP working paper, provided they fall within one of PEP's thematic areas and subject to PEP's peer review procedures.

viii) Be elected as a Corporate Member.

ix) If elected (see point viii), represent the *Research Fellows* in the Corporate Membership at the Annual Meeting.

Eligibility

Research Fellows who are a member of a PEP Thematic Research Group, a representative of Partners or a member of PEP staff are not eligible to benefit from the advantages provided to *Research Fellows* (study visits, conference, etc.), or act as a Corporate Member at the General Assembly.

Decisions to award this Fellowship will be based on: the candidates' past or present links with PEP, their current level of activity and the quality of their research or training activities in [PEP's thematic areas](#), and their potential contribution to the visibility and credibility of PEP activities in these thematic areas.

Application

To be considered, please submit the following to PEP:

- (1) A letter of motivation
- (2) A detailed and up-to-date CV
- (3) The names and full contact details of two references from the PEP network ([Board Members](#), [Executive Director](#), [Resource Persons](#), [PEP Research Group Committees](#)).
