- Journals/books in which you have been published

Style

- Use the third person (he/she)
- Concise sentences
- One theme per paragraph/section
- Adapt the structure to your story, as needed

Example (120 words)

Dr Jane Doe is a senior researcher at the National Research Institute, Kenya. She is currently leading a project to investigate the microeconomic impacts of drought in Turkana County.

Dr Doe holds a PhD in Environmental Economics from Cornell University, USA and a Master's in Development Economics from Makerere University, Uganda. Her key research interests include climate change economics, poverty, environmental policy, economic development and growth, and sustainability.

Previously, she spent five years as an Economist at Kenya's National Environment Management Authority. There, she helped develop the Green Growth and Employment Programme.

She has received several professional awards, including the KSMG Best Practice Award. Her papers have been published in several international journals, including World Development and Environment, Development and Sustainability.
